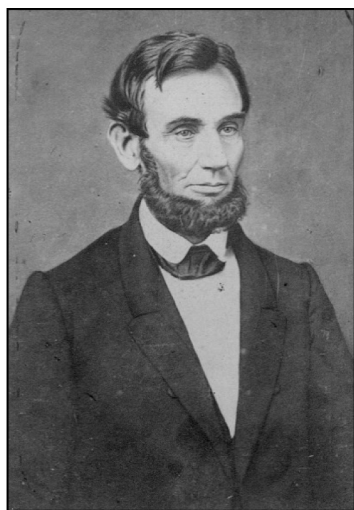


What if Lincoln and McClellan had debated?

In the fall of 1862, 150 years ago, the course of the Civil War changed. The Battle of Antietam was a tactical victory for the Union and it gave Lincoln the edge he needed to formally announce the Emancipation Proclamation, which would go into effect on January 1, 1863. After Antietam McClellan had once again failed to pursue Lee's army and a month later Lincoln relieved McClellan of command. McClellan, a Princeton graduate and a patrician by upbringing, moved to Orange, New Jersey. In 1864 he became the Democratic candidate for President. He was a favorite son in New Jersey and carried the state — and Bergen County — easily. McClellan later became Governor of New Jersey.

In the historic setting of the Brick House, a Federal Greek Revival home built in 1851, actors Bob Costello as Lincoln and Ken Hall as McClellan will hold forth on the issues of the day. Bob Costello has performed widely in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Joe Truglio of the Phil Kearny Civil War Roundtable said, "Bob Costello is incredible ... you will feel like you are in the company of Lincoln." Joseph Garrera, Executive Director, Lehigh Valley Heritage Museum said, "Robert Costello is the complete Lincoln. Along with the look of Lincoln, he has the knowledge of Lincoln."
